Community Quilts

We've been busy here at Community Quilts. We received 2 large bags of fabric from the collection of Laura Williams, which



we cut into kits. The kits will be available at the May meeting. In addition, we received 2 quilts. We have had a request

from <u>In Home Companions</u>, a local company that provides in home care, for 24 fidget mats to aid in the care of their dementia and brain trauma patients. These patients are between 14 and 80, they are men and women, and they live between New Buffalo and Battle Creek. We have had one donated so far. I have looked for tutorials online and found a great one from

PatchworkPosse.<u>https://www.patchworkposse</u> .com/fidget-quilts/ .I also found many pictures for inspiration on Pinterest. Vicki, my liaison, asked that the fidget mats include a clear plastic window which can hold a picture, as many of her patients' families send photos which can become damaged from repeated handling. Vicki also said that her patients enjoy crinkly paper. Denise Donavin added a sleeve containing parchment paper to her fidget mat which works perfectly. Patterns and magazines with feet! They seem to be in every room in the house. This month the organizational task is to gather, sort and categorize the patterns and magazines!

Talking with many folks, patterns are sorted by designer, by technique used, by theme (childrens quilts, masculine quilts, seasonal quilts, or other. It's up to you and your style. But take a look at what you have, and what you want to do. File the patterns you love and share the ones you'll never open. What were you thinking when you bought them?

If you sew clothing, many folks sort the patterns by number and category similar to how they are sorted in the large pattern books at the store. A master list is generated and kept on the front of the container.

Magazines are tricky! They can be kept together as a unit and store and sorted by name and date. But if you only have one quilt in the magazine that you want to keep, then maybe taking those pages out/or copy them and storing them with your patterns will save some space. Digitizing the pictures/patterns/articles are another option.

Enjoy looking through your patterns and magazines!
