BTCQ meeting, March 11, 2020 At Stevensville United Methodist Church Stevensville, Michigan

Meeting called to order at 7 p.m. by co-Presidents Barb Manning and Kathy Martus. Minutes from November, 2019 approved.

Treasurer's report. Treasurer Denise Tackett reported that the February report was approved by the Board. The January report will be in the April newsletter.

Barb Manning said next meeting will be the first Thursday in April (April 2) and not the second Thursday because of Easter holiday celebrations at the church.

February meeting was canceled due to snow storm. Members were notified by email and phone calls. In the future, notifications will be by our website, email, Facebook, and by local radio station WSJM. WSJM also has a website and will mention closures.

Due to generosity of the Methodist church, we were not charged for the canceled February meeting. We are now paid through March 2021.

Jane Rush, Vice President and website chair announced that our website has been updated and includes the calendar and policies and procedures. Membership information not included because of security issues. Password now is BTCQ but will be changed in the future. Jane asked that Committee chairs send her one or two sentences to be included in website.

Committees

Community Quilts. Co-chair Nancy Hawley announced that the Guild will be donating quilts to three organizations this year.

- 1. Logan House in Benton Harbor which provides services to those with developmental disabilities and their families. Need quilts that are 36 x 42 inches.
- 2. Pine Ridge nursing home. Need 36 x 42 inch quilts for wheel chair patients..
- 3. Berrien County Emergency Shelter in Benton Harbor. They work with people for up to 30 days until they get more permanent housing. Need 36 x 42 inch quilts for children and 50 x 60 inch or larger for adults.

Easy way to sew a $36 \ge 42$ quilt is to use $42.6 \frac{1}{2}$ squares, six across and 7 down. No sashing or border. Fifty quilts have been donated. Preprinted and iron-on labels are available, along with batting. Please put name in for drawing when you contribute a quilt.

Nancy urged members to take fabric home from the donation table. Fabric not taken will be donated.

Library – Chair Marilyn Herrman described three books. She needs a substitute for the April 2 meeting.

Red, White and Blue Quilt Show --June 13, 14 in connection with Three Oaks Flag Day celebration

• Denise Tackett – coordinated with Three Oaks committee -- 15 Quilts of Valor will be given to veterans. These quilts should be no smaller than 55 x 65 inches and no larger

than 60 x 70 inches. Let her know immediately if any quilt needs to be quilted. She ordered labels. Some 12-inch blocks for Quilts of Valor have not been returned. Need missing d blocks so can put together in quilts

- General quilts to be included in show need to be registered by April meeting. Let cochairs know if your quilt entry is for sale. Three Oaks committee has made inquiries.
- Lynn Folino showed wonderful quilt she made for family of Three Oaks veteran who passed away. Barb Manning quilted the quilt.

Speakers

Chair Chris Andrews said no speaker or workshops in June because of quilt show. Chris asked if members would be interested in workshops run by Ruth Ann Berry from Quilters Clinic (Fife Lake, MI) in July. Workshops would cost about \$40. Kits \$50. Pattern \$9. Greg Barner of Kingsley MI will be speaker in October.

Spring Retreat

- Co-chairs Peri Hansen and Kay Wilcox announced that the Celebration of Life for Laura Williams will be at Bridgman Library Community Room April 8 from 12 to 3. Laura's quilts will be on display and refreshments served. Donations can be made in her memory to Friends of Library and/or Patriotic Quilts of which she was Chair. There was a moment of silence in remembrance of Laura.
- Tonight is last night for registering for Retreat April 16-19 or 14-19 in Shipshewana. Theme will be "Come Fly with Me". Peri, Kay and Kim Otte showed three quilts with flying geese that will be a project to work on at the retreat.

- Cindy Shepherd announced that there is a new quilt shop in Dowagiac named Quilted Oak Leaf.
