# Berrien Towne and Country Quilters Guild Meeting

#### July 8, 2021

Barb Manning called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM by welcoming everyone back to the Methodist Church in Stevensville. This is the first indoor meeting since March of 2020 due to the Covid pandemic. There are approximately 45 people in attendance.

#### **Old Business**

A motion was made by Sarah Lawrick to approve the June guild meeting minutes, seconded by Audrey Elwell, M/C. Jane Rush filled in with the newsletter this month. She is checking a few email addresses. It costs the guild over \$1.00 to US Mail newsletters. Please consider email over hardcopy. The Box Factory of Arts has approved a 2022 quilt show for our guild. Jane Rush and Denise Tackett have volunteered to be co-chair. The Box Factory will charge 30% of entry ticket sales. They have plenty of parking and handicap accessible. Jane encourages people to join the committee; they will be meeting after August. The Box Factory has their own hanging system. We will not be using our poles to hang quilts. This will limit the number of our full size quilts to possibly less than 20. The show is scheduled for mid July 2022. Two days to setup with the show Friday, Saturday and Sunday. We will have vendors.

Denise Tackett has volunteered to design a raffle quilt. The committee will be trying to keep costs down, have a great show and be profitable.

The Quilt of Valor presentation was very successful, Barb reports. The group was asked if they were willing to make blocks for future Quilts of Valor if we participate next year at the Three Oaks Flag Day Celebration... YES.

#### **New Business**

Jane Rush is looking for Executive Board Officers for 2022. Jane will be contacting people, please consider volunteering. The church is paid through the first 4 months of 2022.

Michelle Tuller (Corner Curve Quilts) has donated a portion of sales at the June guild meeting. Michelle presented a check to the guild for \$28.00, thank you Michelle. A long time guild member, Kaye Swansen has been moved to assisted living in Texas. Her stash was donated to our guild and was brought this evening to share with everyone. Kay Craw reports there is a place near Ludington that is requesting quilts for veterans. This 1,200 acre facility is for veterans to attend. The facility is looking to give a quilt to each family (twin to full size). If you would like to donate a quilt please bring to the August guild meeting. Kay will be taking them after the August meeting and hopes to have a few to take. Complete details have been posted on FaceBook or you can contact Kay.

Community Quilts had a sewing day at a quilt shop in South Bend. They completed 8 quilts. The Logan Center and a traveling nurse have

requested quilts. They gave a little demonstration on how to make a marble quilt (an 8 ½" x 11" mini quilt with quilting lines at least 1 ¼" apart to create a maze that a marble can be rolled thru). These mini quilts can take 15-30 minutes to make start to finish. Let's see how many we can make! Motion was made by Cathy Benke to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Maxine Wantuch. M/C

Raffle Baskets were won by Maxine Wantuch and Greta Parker. We made \$41 tonight. The Program this evening was continuing to make a journal cover. Michelle Tuller demonstrated the technique.

The evening was topped off with a beautiful show and tell.

# **Program Committee**

Hello.

Have you found some time to sew this summer? Are the flowers in your garden providing quilting inspiration? Did you try to make more fabric out of your scraps like I showed at the last meeting? If so, I will be showing you the next steps to create the journal cover.

If you missed the meeting and want to make some fabric from scraps, here's what you do.. Take a piece of light weight fusible interfacing, any size will work. But a 8 1/2" x 4 1/2" is a good size to start with. Place the fusible side up, and lay fabric scraps of any shape on top of the interfacing, overlapping

edges. Press according to interfacing directions. If some of the fusible is still showing, cover with piece with parchment paper to protect your iron. An optional step is to layer with muslin and topstitch the pieces down. I prefer to wait until quilting the whole project and use decorative stitches to topstitch down as part of the quilting. The front with the circle that was made in June, should be mounted on a 8 1/2" x 12 1/2" piece of fabric. Add more fabric until the front measures 11 1/2" x 12 1/2." The back will use the created piece of scrappy fabric. I am looking forward to showing you how to finish your journal cover and more. Let's go sew! Michelle and Nicole **Program Co-chairs**
